

Foolproof Fall Overseeding



Maintaining a healthy lawn is important all year long but Fall provides the perfect opportunity to refresh your lawn no matter if you are in a cool or warm seasonal climate. Follow these foolproof tips to help get the most out of your fall overseeding efforts:



Aerate to let water, air and fertilizer seep into the soil easily.



Be careful to choose the best seed for your area and climate.



Spread your seed in a crisscross pattern to ensure even coverage across your lawn.



Mow and dethatch to remove dead grass and expose the top layer of soil



Timing is key. Planting too early or too late in the season can delay or prevent germination.



Rake after you've overseeded to cover the seeds with a little bit of soil.



Reduce watering to once per day after the new grass has grown 1" tall.



Keep off the lawn for a week if possible. Foot traffic could cause the seeds to be displaced.



Water twice per day to start, in order for seeds to germinate.
